Re: City's Response to the Coronavirus

During the City Council meeting, the Council will be reviewing the City's response to the coronavirus. The Mayor thought it would be beneficial for the Council to have a discussion regarding whether further measures should be taken. For instance:

- Should the City postpone all open houses? There is currently an open house scheduled on Thursday, March 26th from 6:00-7:00 pm regarding the bandshell. There is no formal presentation, so the attendance should be dissipated.
- Should the City postpone all or some Commission meetings? The Commissions are all discussing important topics, but the urgency is being dictated by the City.
- Should the City limit the number of Council meetings? It would be challenging to have the Council meetings by telephone or other electronic means. Instead, the Council could consider having one longer meeting a month with no work session.

Currently, many larger gatherings (1,000+ people) are being cancelled but smaller gatherings have yet to be impacted. The Council should discuss whether the City should be reconsidering some of their public gatherings. Staff will continue to monitor how other cities are addressing the coronavirus.
